Where can you go hunting?

"Department of Conservation" Managed Land

You need to take a valid hunting permit with you at all times to legally hunt on land managed by DOC.

Various conditions apply

Private Land

You will need permission, otherwise it is considered poaching. This includes just walking across the land with your rifle even if you don't intend to hunt on there



You'll need a Department of Conservation Hunting Permit for DOC Managed Land

"Open Hunting" Permit

• "Restricted Hunting" Permits/Areas



How to apply for an Open Hunting Permit

Even with a ballot or restricted permit, you need to have a "DOC hunting permit"

Think of it as a permit to carry firearms on DOC land and then if the area is restricted you need permission to go at the restricted time:

These would be better if they were called Ballot or Special Area Permissions

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How to apply for an Open Hunting Permit

"By using this permit you are agreeing to comply with all the conditions under which it is issued. You understand that you must carry a valid copy of your hunting permit on you at all times when hunting on land managed by DOC. If you are carrying a firearm you understand that you must be the holder of a valid firearms license"



How long does a Hunting Permit last?



Open Area Hunting Permits

You need to take a valid hunting permit with you at all times to legally hunt on land managed by DOC.

You can apply here for a hunting permit to recreationally hunt pigs, chamois, tahr, wallaby, goats and deer in open hunting areas.

When applying you will need to give personal details of the hunter and then select each area in which you expect to hunt over the next months.

There is no need to renew a permit, simply apply for a new permit

This permit is not valid from 10 March to 31 May for the Lochnagar block (restricted for the ROAR) – during this period a restricted area permit is required from the Queenstown Office or Visitor Centre. Foot access into the Glenorchy and Cardrona areas, via access easements, requires permission from the adjoining landowner if firearms and/or dogs are to be taken. Permission is also required from Branches Station prior to foot or vehicle access into the Upper Shotover/Sharks Tooth/Lochnagar/Ballarat Creek (via the Floodburn) hunting areas. Woodbine Station and Routeburn Station runholders must be informed prior to hunting in the Kowhai/Kinloch Bush CA. No shooting is permitted within 500 metres of Woodbine Station homestead. Permit conditions:

- Each person within a hunting party and intending to hunt must have a separate permit
- Permits cannot be transferred to, or be used by, anyone else
- To get a hunting permit (except for possums) a valid firearms licence is required.



Standard Conditions....

- Standard conditions
- This Permit authorises ground based non-commercial hunting of only deer, pigs, goats, wallabies, chamois or thar/tahr within the timeframe specified as "permit validity period", unless otherwise stated in the Special Conditions.
- The Permit is only valid for the "open zone" area specified as green in the map associated with the permit area (maps are available in the permit application system when an area is selected).
- Hunters using a firearm must abide by the NZ Police Arms Code and the Arms Act 1983.
- The following activities are strictly prohibited:

 Hunting during the hours of darkness (1/2 hour after sunset to 1/2 hour before sunrise).

 Hunting with spotlights, torches, vehicle headlights, or any other artificial light source.

 Hunting with any night vision equipment, thermal imaging, infrared or heat detecting devices.

 Attaching a torch or other light source to a firearm.

 - Hunting with any shotgun, rimfire rifle, 17 or 22 hornet calibre, air rifle, or tracer and incendiary type ammunition
- No firearm shall be discharged:

 In the vicinity of huts, tracks, campsites, road-ends or other public places.

 Within 500m of a Great Walk Hut or track. See https://www.doc.govt.nz/parks-and-recreation/things-to-do/walking-and-tramping/great-walks/

 In a manner that endangers, frightens or annoys members of the public, or that endangers any property.
- Only centre fire rifles of calibre .222 Remington or larger may be used for hunting, or crossbows and bows that meet the minimum standard specified by DOC (available at www.doc.govt.nz/hunting).
- This Permit does not authorise access to any land held under lease or where access is restricted by the Department. For details about land held under lease or restricted areas, contact the nearest Department of Conservation office.
- This Permit does not allow access over any private land. Permission to cross any private land must be obtained from the land owner or occupier.
- The Permit does not allow vehicles or dogs to be taken or used for hunting, unless otherwise stated in the Special Conditions above.
- Carcasses and offal must not be left at, or in the vicinity of, tracks, huts, campsites, or in waterways.
- This Permit is not transferable and must be produced on demand to any warranted officer, Department of Conservation staff member, or Police officer.
- Breach of any conditions of this Permit renders this Permit null and void and may result in prosecution.
- The Department of Conservation may suspend or cancel this Permit for any reason by public notice, notice on the Department's website, email, or letter to the Permit Holder.
- Standard notes

 - Be a responsible hunter. Follow the responsible hunting code (www.doc.govt.nz/hunting.
 If you wish to hunt for animals or in a manner that is not covered by this permit, contact the nearest Department of Conservation Office for information on how to apply for a permit for your intended activity.
 Information on pesticide use and other activities that may affect your hunting can be found at www.doc.govt.nz/hunting
 Hunters must always identify their target beyond all doubt! You are responsible every time you discharge your hunting weapon. Better safe than sorry.



4. The following activities are strictly prohibited:

- Hunting during the hours of darkness (1/2 hour after sunset to 1/2 hour before sunrise).
- Hunting with spotlights, torches, vehicle headlights, or any other artificial light source.
- Hunting with any night vision equipment, thermal imaging, infrared or heat detecting devices.
- Attaching a torch or other light source to a firearm.
- Hunting with any shotgun, rimfire rifle, 17 or 22 hornet calibre, air rifle, or tracer and incendiary type ammunition



5. No firearm shall be discharged:

- In the vicinity of huts, tracks, campsites, road-ends or other public places.
- Within 500m of a Great Walk Hut or track.
- In a manner that endangers, frightens or annoys members of the public, or that endangers any property.



Standard Conditions....

- 8. Permission to cross any private land must be obtained from the land owner or occupier.
- 9. The Permit does not allow vehicles or dogs to be taken or used for hunting, unless otherwise stated in the Special Conditions above.



Special Conditions

When you apply for your permit there are sometimes special conditions, and the details for that area are shown in the permit.

For example:-

Takitimu Snowdon Mavora Eyre Mountains No hunting within a 1km radius of the Mavora Lakes from 20 December to 31 January or public holidays. Dogs may be taken into Mavora Lakes without a permit, but a dog permit is required for Snowden/Eyres/Takitimu Mountains – these are 'Controlled Dog Access Zones'. No dogs in Takitimu or Snowden Forest from 1 September to 30 November. All dogs to be on a leash or in a crate until well into forest and off private land. Permission must be obtained from the Dale Farm manager prior to accessing Snowdon Forest through the Dale Farm easement.

NOTES: Restrictions over Xmas Hols and Dogs are allowed



Special Conditions, what do they normally contain?

Exclusions: Usually roar periods and ballot blocks

Eg. Mt Aspiring National Park

This permit is not valid from 22 March to 22 April (Balloted ROAR blocks) for areas north, east of and including the Matukituki catchment. A separate permit for aircraft access is required - landings are limited. No hunting within 500m of Routeburn Track. Contact Haast Visitor Centre to arrange permission over private land to access Arawhata. No helicopter access permitted in Arawhata or Barrier (wilderness area).

About this hunting block

Animals present are red deer, fallow deer and chamois.

General information

This is a steep beech/tawhai forested block on the eastern flank of the Humboldt Mountains.

This block is covered by an open hunting permit, but a condition is that the neighbouring landholders must be informed before hunting in the area.

Shooting is not allowed within 500 m of Woodbine Homestead.

Access

From Glenorchy follow directions to the Routeburn and Greenstone Tracks. Cross the Dart road bridge then turn left. After about 6 km there is a bridge over the Glacier Burn, where the Glacier Burn track is signposted.

Species present are goats, red deer, fallow deer and chamois, as well as gamebirds in Diamond Lake and Lake Reid.










The landscape has very little closed canopy, and is characterised by tussock grassland, cushion fields, upland bogs, schist tors

Waikaia Forest Conservation Area hunting

Located in Mainland Southland hunting in the Southland region

The balloted 'roar' period runs from the third Monday in March to the third Sunday in April every year.

During this 'roar' period the area is divided into five blocks and balloted for periods of up to three days during the week, or weekends only. An advertisement for ballot applications appears in the Southland Times and the Otago Daily Times on the last Saturday of September each year. Applications close on 31 October.

DOC charges an application fee for the balloted periods to recover costs.

Hunting is not permitted south of the South Coast Track nor within 500 metres of the north side of the track. Hunting south of the track is by permission of the landowner only.






Mount Creighton Dead Horse Creek






Greenstone/Caples Recreational Hunting Area (RHA)

Located in the Otago region

The Greenstone/Caples Recreational Hunting Area (RHA) is 18 000 hectares in size and is a restricted hunting area reserved for the hunting of fallow deer, from 1 April to 30 September. Permits are issued for blocks within the area by ballot.




Greenstone/Caples

All blocks in the Greenstone/Caples Recreational Hunting Area (RHA) are restricted permit blocks issued by way of two ballot draws, one for April/May each year (the croak) and one for June to **September.** Ballot applications are accepted in November and February for the respective ballot periods.



NB Lake Rere is not part of the RHA, it's a separate hunting area which DOC issue permits for on a case-by-case basis. Hunters who access the block via Elfin Bay walkway also need prior permission from the Percy's.

Geoff Owen/Melita from DOC confirmed in 2018 "If anyone enquires about the area feel free to enquire pass on my details as I issue permits with the approval of Dave Girling."








✓ Hawea Conservation Park Lake Wanaka Lower Matukituki Valley This permit is not valid from 22 March to 22 April (Balloted ROAR blocks). A separate permit for aircraft access is required if not using an authorised operator. 4WD access to Minaret Burn and Lower Matukituki Valley requires permission of land owner. Hunting dogs are allowed in the Lower, Mid and Upper Timaru, Rumbling Burn, West Wanaka, Minaret Burn, Albert Burn and Craigie Burn only with permission of access landowner.





South Westland Weheka Due to high visitor numbers there is no hunting in the Fox Glacier Valley below the 500 metre above sea level contour; including the Te Weheka Walkway/Cycleway. No hunting in Copland valley 20 December to 31 January and between Good Friday and Easter Monday. No dogs allowed in Westland Tai Poutini or Mount Aspiring National Parks. For other places contact the Franz Josef Glacier or Haast Visitor Centres. This permit is valid during the Haast Roar period for Open hunting block areas. To view block boundaries, dates and for more information check the DOC Website. Contact Haast Visitor Centre for access details to the Arawhata. No helicopter access permitted in the Adams Wilderness Area.



 - Some incur a cost (Haast, Wapiti)
 - Some are only available via the local DOC office
 - Plan your trips ahead phone up for cancellations
- Ask members about the areas
- Return all ballot information (RHAs, Wapiti etc)
- Dates of Ballots are on the website calendar


